Incidents of Special Interest

On October 29th, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m., The Hamden Police Department and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) offered the public another opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous, expired, unused and unwanted prescription drugs. Many families brought medications for disposal to the lobby of the Miller Memorial Library. The service was free and anonymous, no questions were asked. Citizen participation far exceeded expectations. Hamden received 93.6 pounds of turned in medications. Total statewide amount was 3691.7 pounds. Deputy Chief Kicak stated that the event went very well.

On October 27th at approximately 9:30p.m., Hamden Police responded to the area of Dixwell Avenue and Circular Avenue on the report of a passenger on a Connecticut Transit bus with a handgun. Upon arrival, officers removed Juan Boyd Jr. from the bus. Investigation revealed that Boyd Jr. was allegedly making loud statements that he was in the possession of a gun and that he was going to "take care of business." Officers did not locate a firearm. Juan Boyd Jr., 34, of 559 West Ivy Street, New Haven was arrested and charged with Threatening in the 2nd Degree and Breach of Peace. Boyd Jr., who was released after posting a \$2,500 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 10th. Officers Mark Gery and Mark Katz conducted the investigation.

On October 27th the Hamden Police Department Street Interdiction Team executed a search and seizure warrant at Krowns Palace, 1461 Dixwell Avenue. The search led to the discovery of 7.5 grams of marijuana and drug paraphernalia. In connection with this address, officers arrested: Marcus Young, 32, of 403 Mill Rock Avenue, Hamden, Ct. He was charged with Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Illegal Possession of Marijuana Within 1500 Feet of School Grounds and Illegal Distribution. Marcus Young, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$20,000 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 9th. Young was also arrested on several outstanding warrants for the charge of Failure to Appear.

On October 26th at approximately 12:15p.m., while on routine patrol Officer William Onofrio of the Hamden Police Department observed an alleged drug transaction on Dix Street. His investigation led to the search of the residence of Chaz Yopp, 75 George Street. As officers attempted to search Yopp's bedroom, Britt Martin, blocked the entry. Martin allegedly pushed an officer. He was subsequently placed under arrest, after a brief struggle. Upon searching Yopp's bedroom, officers located 146.9 grams of marijuana, .38 caliber revolver and drug paraphernalia. Yopp was promptly arrested. Chaz Yopp, 18, of 75 George Street, Hamden was charged with Possession of a Pistol without a Permit, Possession of Narcotics, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Marijuana with the Intent to Sell, Operating a Drug Factory and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. Yopp, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$100,000 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 16th. Brit Martin, 28, of 245 Alston Avenue, New Haven, was charged with Interfering with an Investigation. Martin is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 16th

October 26th: During August 2011, the Department of Emergency Services and Public Protection Sex Offender Registry Unit notified Hamden Police, that Jerome Moye had not been in compliance with the sex offender unit. Moye was not in compliance for failing to verify his address. Moye was convicted in 2002 for Sexual Assault in the 2nd Degree to a Minor and Risk of Injury to a Minor. Sergeant Colin Kearns of the Hamden Police Department Detective Division subsequently submitted an arrest warrant application to the court. On October 26th, Hamden Police Detective Raymond Quinn, who is assigned to the United States Marshal Service Connecticut Violent Fugitive Task Force, observed Moye on the front steps of a New Haven courthouse. He was promptly arrested. Jerome Moye, 28, of 45 Burke Street, Hamden was charged with Failure to register as a Sex Offender. Jerome Moye, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$20,000 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 2nd.

On October 25th at approximately 1:00a.m., Officer Robert Manfield of the Hamden Police Department observed a motor vehicle traveling on Morse Street with an expired registration. Officer Manfield attempted to conduct a motor vehicle stop, however, was led on a slow-speed pursuit. The vehicle eventually stopped on Shelton Avenue in New Haven. Investigation revealed that the operator, identified as Neville Williams, swallowed a "marijuana joint" as he was fleeing from police. He was subsequently arrested. Neville Williams, 46, of 26 Irving Street, New Haven was charged with Tampering with Evidence, Interfering with an Officer, Operating without a License, Engaging an Officer in Pursuit and Failure to Renew Registration. Williams, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$1,500.00 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 2nd.

On October 24th at approximately 3:15p.m., Hamden Police responded to Old Navy, 2335 Dixwell Avenue, on the report of a shoplifting. Investigation revealed that a customer, identified as Robert Hallett, exited the store with 2 bags of merchandise. Hallett allegedly pushed an employee before he left the store. Further investigation revealed that Hallett then entered Stop and Shop, at which time Officer Michael Pantera approached him. Upon exiting Stop and Shop, Hallett allegedly pushed Officer Pantera and then fled on foot. Officer Pantera was able to subdue Hallett, after a physical struggle in front of the store. A Loss Prevention Officer from a nearby store assisted him. Officer Pantera sustained minor injuries. Officers learned that Hallett had stolen over \$900 in merchandise from Old Navy. Officers further learned that Hallett was on Parole. Hamden Police arrested: Robert Hallett, 41, of 41 Redfield Street, New Haven. He was charged with Robbery in the 3rd Degree, Assault on a Police Officer, Larceny in the 5th Degree and Interfering with a Police Officer. Hallett, who was detained on a \$50,000 bond, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 7th.

On October 24th at approximately 12:15a.m., Officer Shawn Nutchter of the Hamden Police Department observed a motor vehicle traveling on Pine Rock Avenue with defective equipment. Officer Nutchter attempted to conduct a motor vehicle stop. The vehicle fled into New Haven, eventually stopping on Blake Street. The operator of the vehicle, identified as Darryl Giles, subsequently exited the vehicle and fled on foot. He was arrested after a foot pursuit. Officers found 7 bags of marijuana and 77 empty bags, which are used to package the drugs, in his possession. Investigation revealed that Darryl Giles left his 4 year-old son inside of the vehicle, while he engaged police in both a vehicular and foot pursuit. Further investigation revealed that the Connecticut State Police wanted Giles on the strength of 2 felony arrest warrants. Darryl Giles, 21, of 151 Fitch Street, New Haven was arrested and charged with Risk of Injury to a Minor, Possession of Marijuana, Possession of Marijuana with the Intent to Sell, Interfering with a Police Officer, Engaging an Officer in Pursuit, Reckless Driving, Dark-Tinted Windows and Failure to Display Front License Plate. Giles, who was released to the custody of the Connecticut State Police, is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden.

On October 21st at approximately 10:30a.m., Hamden Police responded to the Farmington Canal Trail on the report of a suspicious person. Officers received information that a male individual was rummaging through a purse. The individual was seen running southbound on the trail, towards Mather Street. Officer Patrick McCue subsequently detained the individual, a 17 year-old Hamden resident. Further investigation revealed that the juvenile allegedly burglarized a motor vehicle that was parked in a parking lot of a Dixwell Avenue business. The purse was allegedly taken from the vehicle. A 17 year-old Hamden resident was arrested and charged with Burglary in the 3rd Degree and Larceny in the 6th Degree. He was released after posting a \$500 bond. He is scheduled to appear in court in Meriden on November 8th.

October 19, 2011 David B. Fein, United States Attorney for the District of Connecticut, announced that Tony Richardson, 53, of New Haven, was sentenced by Senior United States District Judge Ellen Bree Burns in New Haven to 78 months of imprisonment, followed by three years of supervised release, for distributing heroin. This matter stems from a Drug Enforcement Administration Task Force investigation dubbed "Operation Brick House," which targeted a heroin distribution organization based in New Haven that was headed by Tarulus Glass, also known as "Dred," and his associates. The investigation employed several law-enforcement techniques, including the use of confidential informants, controlled purchases of heroin, physical surveillance, and the use of court-authorized wiretaps on cellular telephones utilized by some of the defendants. The investigation revealed that Glass and his associates obtained prepackaged heroin from sources of supply in the New York metropolitan area and distributed it to drug sellers in and around New Haven, including Richardson.

During the course of the investigation, DEA Task Force officers seized heroin, cocaine and crack cocaine, four firearms and three vehicles. A total of 11 individuals have been charged as a result of the investigation. On July 19, 2011, Richardson pleaded guilty to one count of conspiracy to distribute heroin. Glass has pleaded guilty and awaits sentencing. This matter is being investigated by the DEA New Haven Task Force, which includes participants from the New Haven, Meriden, Hamden, West Haven, Branford and Ansonia Police Departments, and the United States Marshals Service.

On October 18, 2011, at approximately 1:40 p.m., members of the Patrol and Traffic Divisions were dispatched to the area of Old Dixwell Avenue and Evergreen Avenue on a report of a struck pedestrian. Preliminary investigation revealed that an elderly male was struck by a motor vehicle while crossing Old Dixwell Avenue. The pedestrian identified as George Ferrie Jr. 87, of 43 Briarcliff Road Hamden was treated at the scene by Hamden Fire Rescue personnel for serious head injuries and transported to Yale New Haven Hospital. During the early evening hours, Yale-New Haven Hospital personnel notified Hamden Police that Mr. Ferrie had died. On October 19, 2011, Ferrie's body was transported to the Office of

the Chief Medical Examiner for an autopsy. Officer David Falcigno of the Traffic Division is continuing the investigation.

On October 17, 2011, Meriden Superior Court issued a Protective Order against Gerald Lawrence regarding a previous arrest. A portion of the order stated that he was to have no contact with his ex-girlfriend. On October 18, 2011, at approximately 6:00 a.m., Lawrence forcibly entered his ex-girlfriend's Dennis Circle residence. He then allegedly walked into her bathroom, but she was able to convince him to leave. A short time thereafter, Officers Mark Sheppard and Nick Lovett of the Patrol Division arrested Lawrence. He was subsequently transported to police headquarters. Gerald Lawrence, 32, of 49 Blacey Street, Hamden, was charged with Burglary in the 2nd Degree and Criminal Violation of a Protective Order. Lawrence, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$150,000 bond, was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 19, 2011.

On October 14, 2011, at approximately 5:00 p.m., members of the Patrol Division responded to the area of 1954 State Street on the report of a dispute. Furthermore, officers were advised that a truck was fleeing from the area. Moments later, Officer Mark Katz of the Patrol Division stopped the vehicle in question on Carmalt Street. An occupant of the vehicle told officers that she contacted her ex-boyfriend, Thomas Vollano, and asked him to sell her marijuana. When they met him, Vollano allegedly stole her money. A fight then erupted between 2 females. Vollano, who was in the possession of a golf club, allegedly became involved. He then allegedly struck the windshield of the vehicle, which contained his ex-girlfriend. Thomas Vollano was subsequently arrested. Thomas Vollano, 28, of 45 Terrace Street, New Haven, was charged with Robbery in the 2nd Degree and Criminal Mischief in the 3rd Degree. Vollano, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$10,000 bond, was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 27, 2011. Officer Eric Goclowski of the Patrol Division conducted the investigation.

On October 13, 2011, at approximately 11:00 a.m., members of the Patrol Division responded to 141 Gorham Avenue on the report of a domestic dispute between a mother and son. Investigation revealed that the son, Nicholas Guarino, allegedly threatened to shoot his mother. He subsequently fled on foot prior to the officer's arrival. Hamden Police, believing that Guarino was armed, immediately contacted the Helen Street School administration and the school was placed on "lockdown" for approximately 20 minutes.

Moments later, officers located Guarino inside his girlfriend's residence. He surrendered to police after a brief telephone conversation. Further investigation led to a discovery of 3.6 grams of marijuana which allegedly belonged to Guarino and his girlfriend. Nicholas Guarino, 18, of 141 Gorham Avenue, Hamden, was arrested and charged with Threatening in the 2nd Degree, Possession of Marijuana, Interfering with an Officer and Disorderly Conduct. Conduct. Guarino, was detained at police headquarters on a \$10,000 bond, and was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 14, 2011. A 17 year-old Hamden resident was also arrested and charged with Possession of Marijuana and Interfering with a Police Officer. She was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 25, 2011. Officer Ronald Glifort of the Patrol Division conducted the investigation.

On October 12, 2011, Detective Mark Consorte, the Court Liaison officer, arrested Joseph Conte Jr. at Meriden Superior Court on the strength of an active arrest warrant. Conte, Jr., 30, of 11 Weaver Circle, North Haven, was charged with Burglary in the 3rd Degree and Larceny in the 3rd Degree. He was detained on a \$10,000 court ordered bond. The arrest warrant was based on an incident that had occurred on August 26, 2011, when Hamden Police responded to a Westwood's Road residence on the report of a burglary. Investigation revealed that an individual entered the home through an unlocked window. Once inside, thousands of dollars in jewelry was stolen. Hamden Police, with the assistance of the Cheshire Police Department, determined that Joseph Conte Jr. was allegedly responsible for the crime. Detective Sean Dolan conducted the investigation.

On October 12, 2011, at approximately 4:00 p.m., Officers Mike DiMaria and Nick Lovett of the Patrol Division responded to a Glenbrook Avenue residence on the report of a burglary. Upon arrival, the officers found 2 individuals inside of the house. Investigation revealed that they had entered the house through an unlocked window and both subjects were promptly arrested. Marcello Bobe, 20, of 6 Glenbrook Avenue, Hamden, was charged with Burglary in the 3rd Degree and Criminal Trespass in the 3rd Degree. Bobe, who was detained at police headquarters on a \$10,000 bond, was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 26, 2011. Phillip Justin Hill, 27, of 26 Glenbrook Avenue, Hamden, was charged with Burglary in the 3rd Degree and Criminal Trespass in the 3rd Degree. Hill, who was released on a Written Promise to Appear, is scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 26, 2011.

On October 8, 2011, at approximately 2:35 a.m., members of the Patrol Division responded to 37 Williamson Road on the report of a serious assault. The Connecticut State Police Troop I received the initial 911 call. Upon arrival, officers needed to force entry through the front door. Once inside, officers found a 41 year-old female, identified as Frances Piscitelli, lying motionless in bed. Lying next to her was her 41 year-old boyfriend, David Borelli. A preliminary investigation revealed that Piscitelli was stabbed in the stomach and that her throat was slit. Hamden Fire Rescue rendered medical assistance and Piscitelli was transported to Yale-New Haven Hospital, where she underwent emergency surgery. Piscitelli died a short time later. David Borelli was also transported to the Hospital of Saint Raphael with lacerations to his wrists. He was released to the custody of the Police Department and was subsequently arrested. David Borrelli, 41, of 37 Williamson Road, Hamden, was charged with Murder. Borrelli, was detained on \$1,000.000 bond and appeared in Meriden Superior Court on October 11, 2011. The Detective Division is continuing the investigation and the incident is being investigated as a case of Domestic Violence.

On October 8, 2011, at approximately 7:30 a.m., members of the Patrol Division responded to Sammy's Grocery Store, 863 Dixwell Avenue, on the report of an armed robbery. Upon arrival, officers learned that a lone male entered the store, brandishing a firearm. He then -jumped over the counter and demanded that the employee open the cash register. The individual subsequently removed an undetermined amount of money. The male, who is described as dark skinned, wearing black-colored clothing and a black mask, fled on foot through the front door. Officer Jason Venditto and his police K-9 "Titan" of the Patrol Division conducted a track, which led to the area of Alling Street, but the suspect was not located.

On October 5, 2011, David B. Fein, United States Attorney for the District of Connecticut, announced that Ryan Moore, 22, of New Haven, was sentenced by Senior United States District Judge Ellen Bree Burns in New Haven to 36 months of imprisonment, followed by three years of supervised release, for distributing crack cocaine. This matter stems from a joint law enforcement investigation conducted by the FBI New Haven Safe Streets Task Force, the DEA New Haven Task Force, the New Haven Police Department and the Hamden Police Department. Through the use of court-authorized wiretaps, investigating officers identified and dismantled a large drug-trafficking organization that was centered in the Newhallville section of New Haven and Hamden, and was responsible for the distribution of crack cocaine and cocaine throughout the Greater New Haven area. According to court documents and statements made in court, from August through October 2010, MOORE, an admitted member of a violent street gang known as "R2", was intercepted several times over a wiretap ordering distribution quantities of crack cocaine from other members of the drug trafficking organization, which he then sold to his own customer base for profit. On March 9, 2011, MOORE pleaded guilty to one count of conspiracy to possess with intent to distribute cocaine base ("crack cocaine"). Forty-seven individuals have been charged in federal court with various narcotics offenses as a result of this investigation. This matter was investigated by the Federal Bureau of Investigation's New Haven Safe Streets Task Force (composed of members of members of the New Haven, Ansonia, Milford and East Haven Police Department, and the Connecticut State Police and the Connecticut Department of Correction), the Drug Enforcement Administration's New Haven Task Force (composed of members of the New Haven, West Haven, Meriden, Ansonia, Hamden and Branford Police Departments), along with substantial participation by members of the New Haven and Hamden Police Departments. The United States Marshals Service also assisted in the investigation. The investigation was funded in significant part by the United States Attorney's Office Organized Crime Drug Enforcement Task Force and supported by the Office's *Project Safe Neighborhoods* and Anti-Gang programs.

On October 4, 2011, Ian Doernberger was arrested on an outstanding arrest warrant for Assault 2nd degree and Disorderly Conduct. The arrest warrant was based on an incident that had occurred on September 3, 2011, at approximately 11:15 p.m., when officers responded to a West Side Drive residence on the report of an assault. Investigation revealed that a large-scale party was occurring, and as the party concluded, 2 individuals, who attended the party, became involved in a verbal altercation. As they were walking in a residential neighborhood, one of the individuals, who was later identified as Ian Doernberger, allegedly stabbed his 31 year-old acquaintance in the head with a knife. Hamden Fire Rescue treated the victim, a North Haven resident, at the scene. Officers conducted a search for Doernberger, which met with negative results. Officer Michael Nawrocki of the Patrol Division subsequently applied for a warrant for his arrest, and the warrant was approved. Ian Doernberger, 36, of 8 Pine Ridge Road in Woodbridge, was charged with Assault in the 2nd Degree and Disorderly Conduct. Doernberger, who was released on a Written Promise to Appear, was scheduled to appear in Meriden Superior Court on October 18, 2011.

On October 4, 2011, members of the Detective Division and Patrol Division responded to 135 Curtis Drive in New Haven, in search of Oliver Graham, 42, of 287 Division Street, New Haven, Graham was wanted on two outstanding arrest warrants for Domestic Violence charges. Graham was believed to be working at that residence. Officers located Graham and he surrendered to police without incident and was promptly taken into custody. The arrest warrants were based on an incident that had occurred on September 13, 2011, at approximately 5:00 p.m., when a 36 year-old Wintergreen Avenue resident arrived at Police headquarters regarding a family dispute. Officers obtained detailed information and conducted an investigation. An arrest warrant application for Oliver Graham, her ex-husband, was subsequently submitted and approved by the courts. Oliver Graham, 42, of 287 Division Street, New Haven, was charged with Burglary in the 2nd Degree, Strangulation in the 2nd Degree and Threatening. Graham was detained at police headquarters on a court ordered \$250,000 bond. Graham was also arrested for another incident involving his ex-

wife, which had occurred on September 3, 2011. Officers submitted an arrest warrant for the incident, which was subsequently approved. Graham was further charged with Threatening in the 2nd Degree, Unlawful Restraint in the 2nd Degree and Breach of Peace. He was detained at police headquarters on an additional \$50,000 bond.
