The larger story of the 11,500 nurses who served in Vietnam is told through eight women in **Vietnam Nurses with Dana Delaney**. This is a moving story of “the never-ending line of bodies” and the routine nature of saving lives under rocket attacks.

General H. Norman Schwarzkopf hosts **The Long Way Home Project: Men Versus Myth** and mixes an overview of the war in Vietnam with stories of individual soldiers who served their country and then moved on with life as best they could.

The issue of Post Traumatic Stress Disorder is explored in **No Unwounded Soldiers**, a documentary produced by local filmmaker Rebecca Abbott. This program reveals lessons that can apply to soldiers coming home from Iraq and Afghanistan.

In **Local Connection**, six Vietnam Veterans from the New Haven area describe their recollections from the early days of the escalation in 1965 to the Vietnamization efforts in the early 1970's.
