- a) Anthony T. Moore, 18 Murray Street- Requesting speed humps put on the street to slow vehicles down. There are children and pets on our street, and it is not safe for them.
- b) Bianca Woods, 37 Longmeadow Ave- Requesting a “do not block driveway” sign added to my property, driveway is always being blocked. Even when I am home someone is always blocking my driveway.

- d) Kristen Kuselias, 3226 Whitney Avenue- It is dangerous to turn off of Joyce II onto West Todd. There have been at least two significant accidents. There has been a traffic study. Flashing speed limit signs have been placed in the vicinity, but they do not work. You cannot see traffic coming out of that road. There are no stop sign markings. The grass is so overgrown. Something needs to get done before someone get seriously hurt.
- e) Karla Kendrick, 44 North Sheffield Street- Requesting speed bumps or other traffic calming take place for the area. There are many children in the area and the cars seem to use this street as a cut through and speed.
- f) Webster Zackary, Request speed hump or Traffic Calming on Barraclough Avenue. Resident Petition is attached.
- g) Marilyn Dickman, 140 Centerbrook Rd- Requesting sign to inform motorist that they are parked too close to driveways which creates sight line issues for cars pulling out the driveway.

Skiff Street Striping Plan – CTDOT is replacing the Skiff Street bridge over Route 15. When the bridge replacement is complete a new striping plan will be implemented for Skiff Street. Skiff Street is a Town Road and the approval of a striping plan is under the purview of Hamden’s Traffic Authority. CTDOT sent a request on May 31, 2023, asking the town to provide conceptual layout and approval of the striping plan concept by July 10, 2023. The Traffic and Engineering Departments completed the conceptual layout Friday June 9 and are submitting it to the Traffic Authority for approval.

Commissioner, Vaughn Willis made a motion to approve the New Line Striping Plan for Skiff Street. Commissioner, Elaine Dove seconded the motion. The vote was unanimous in favor.
